Skaters' Test Responsibilities

- Keep a copy of all test result sheets. Although Skate Saskatoon and Skate Canada keep copies of test results, your test sheets are the definitive documentation that you have completed a test. If something untoward happens to your test results at the club level or at Skate Canada, you will always have your test sheets to document completion of your tests.
- 2. Ensure that you have completed the required pre-requisites for your tests. Keep a running list of tests you have completed. If you keep this list current, you will see at a glance if your pre-requisites are completed for your next test. Although your coach keeps track of your tests, he/she has many skaters to consider. Take responsibility for your record-keeping and stay in close communication with your coach about your test status.
- **3. Communicate with your coach.** If you wish to register for a test, speak with your coach at least one month ahead of the test day. There are registration deadlines that your coach must meet for your test to be accepted.
- **4.** Purchase your test ticket(s) before the deadline. Deadlines are posted on the test information bulletin board. Extensions will not be provided.
- **5.** Show your test results to your coach. Coaches need to know if you passed your test so that they can update their records and plan accordingly.
- 6. Check the Test Information bulletin board regularly for updates about tests, test days, and deadlines.
- 7. Familiarize yourself with your Achievement Record located on your membership profile on the Skate Canada website (<u>www.skatecanada.ca</u>). Your Achievement Record lists all the tests you have tried. You will need to know your Skate Canada number to access your membership profile.
