VOLUNTEER DEPOSIT

The \$100.00 volunteer deposit charged during winter registration for Advanced Pre-Star and higher skaters (on a per family basis) is in lieu of the fundraising fee charged in previous years (on a per skater basis). The fundraising fee was associated with a booklet of Skaters' Lottery tickets, which is a Skate Canada Saskatchewan fund raising campaign that benefits both the section and our club.

Our club is mandated to sell a prescribed number of tickets each year, dependent on our total registrations. If the registrants of our club choose to not sell ticket books, the club is still responsible to purchase those unsold books. To offset the potential losses there is now a mandatory volunteer deposit. This deposit can be earned back in the following ways.

The below opportunities related to the volunteer deposit will be available:

- 1. Pick up a Lottery ticket booklet from the office value \$100. The tickets can be sold and the funds retained by the family or the family can enter themselves in the draw by completing the ticket(s) with their own information. You will not receive a \$100 credit on your account, this option uses the ability to sell the tickets and keep the \$100 as the refund for the volunteer deposit. The booklets MUST be returned to the office. The deadline will be provided upon pickup.
- 2. Volunteer for club activities:
- To have your account credited with the \$100 volunteer deposit, approximately 6.5 hours of volunteer time is required on any of the five options listed below. It is not possible to earn part of the volunteer deposit back, the full 6.5 hours must be achieved or no credit will be given.
